Long Term Care (LTC)

Long Term Care is in-patient medical care in a skilled nursing facility that is expected to last at least one full calendar month after the month of admission.

Medi-Cal Program

The Medi-Cal program is California's version of the Medicaid program funded jointly by the state and federal government. Although Medi-Cal recipients often receive Medicare, the Medi-Cal Program is not related to Medicare Insurance.

Who May Be Eligible for Long Term Care Medi-Cal?

Any individual residing in a Long Term Care facility may be eligible for the Long Term Care Medi-Cal Program. Anyone may apply on behalf of the LTC resident.

The applicant's property and income may be considered to determine LTC Medi-Cal eligibility.

Income Requirements

Single Person:

There is no income limit, but most of your income will be used to pay the nursing facility where you reside.

Married Persons or Registered Domestic Partners:

Special rules may apply that allow the spouse/partner at home to keep additional income that belongs to the person in Long-Term Care.
